SASGOG 10th Annual Meeting: May 2022 - Call for Abstracts

The Society for Academic Specialists in General Obstetrics and Gynecology (SASGOG) announces the call for abstracts for the 10th Annual Meeting, to be held on May 5, 2022 (or within 1 week of this date). All abstracts must be original work. Case reports will not be considered. All submissions are peer-reviewed and scored on: scientific merit, originality, and relevance to general obstetrics and gynecology. Outstanding abstracts will be eligible for monetary awards.

The deadline to submit an abstract for consideration is Monday, January 10, 2022, at 11:59 PM EST. Submitting authors will be notified of acceptance or rejection, and if accepted, oral or poster presentation, by end of February 2022.

A limited number of meritorious abstracts will be accepted for oral presentation. For poster presentation, additional information will be provided upon acceptance of the abstract.

Please note: At least one author must be a current SASGOG member.
